Who Responded...

The majority of responses were from **parents** of individuals served (56%). **Family Supports Services (FSS)** (30%) was the service most represented by the respondents, followed by **Residential Services** (27%).

How they rated CCDS...

The rating most frequently selected by respondents was 10 out of 10, "extremely satisfied".

The average rating of services provided by CCDS was 9.1 out of 10.

Person Centered Excellence Priorities

Respondents were asked rank whether CCDS is achieving the goals of our CQL Person Centered Excellence Plan established during accreditation.

The majority of respondents agreed or strongly agreed that CCDS was achieving each of the goals:

1. People have authority to plan and pursue their own vision.
2. The Catholic Charities workforce is stable and qualified.
3. People and families play meaningful leadership roles.

- 93% agreed staff are responsive to requests, questions or concerns.
- 90% agreed CCDS staff are available and accessible.

- 93% agreed CCDS staff respect them.
